Director's Note:

Every musical theater enthusiast I know gushes over *She Loves Me*, a small treasure kept alive by the dedication of its fans. Though it is often overshadowed by its flashier contemporaries, *She Loves Me* shines as a golden age gem, touting an achingly beautiful score while maintaining the joy so intrinsic to the American musical. At once complicated and simple, *She Loves Me* endures in our hearts and heads for its dedication to beauty, not only in the chandeliers and perfume bottles of Maraczek's but in the human relationships it explores. It is a piece of warmth and sensitivity, a musical that asks the audience to trust not only the writer and composer, but the characters' dedication to one another.

I first encountered *She Loves Me* the summer after my sophomore year of college, performing nine musicals over ten weeks in a retired barn in Cape Cod. It was our final production of the summer, a much-anticipated end to an over-stimulated few months of performing. A small group of us remained for that final rehearsal process, lamenting our beginning-of-summer selves' overenthusiastic dedication. We all wanted to go home. But something about the grand music and delicate vulnerability of this piece moved us from cynicism. It reminded us why we had signed up to live in a cabin and rehearse in that same cabin for hours on end, and how the intersecting elements of movement, text, music, design and human joy can affect us all on a cellular level.

Mistaken identities, misunderstandings, rumored secrets, enemies to loversthese are elements of storytelling that withstand time and span genre. They are tropes as inherent to Shakespeare and Feydeau as they are to Nora Ephron and Nancy Meyers. Though often dismissed as cheesy, these stories help audiences to see the hidden parts of themselves as at once flawed and beautiful. When characters choose to invest in the kindest, most vulnerable, most generous parts of themselves, they are met with love and support. Some storytelling is revealing in its unrelenting brutality and some its unrelenting love. In a time when we show bits and pieces of ourselves as online avatars, afraid that the world will deem us unworthy, *She Loves Me* dares us to reveal our love for one another and to meet that love with radical acceptance. My hope is that you leave the theater feeling what this musical's dedicated fans felt all those years ago, what my friends and I felt that summer in Massachusetts- a small nugget of lightness and hope. Musical comedy is a serious thing. It is a practice in empathy.

I want to take a moment to thank my students and colleagues here at UVM for their creative energy and support. Thanks to my friends and family for their ability to lift me up and hold me in their hearts.
